The Major Prophets of the Holy Scriptures - Isaiah

In the year of king Uzziah's death (meaning, when he was stricken with leprosy and was isolated), I saw the Lord sitting up on a high and exalted throne, and his train filled the temple. Seraphim were standing around him. Each one had six wings; with two he covered his face, with two covered his feet, and with two did he fly. And one called on to the other and said: Holy, Holy, Holy is the Lord of Hosts; the whole earth is full of His glory. And the posts of the threshold shook at the voices of those that called a loud, and the house was filled with smoke. And I said: 'Woe is me, for I am a man with unclean lips am I, and in the mists of people of unclean lips do I do dwell; for the king, the Lord of Hosts, have my eyes seen.' Then flew one of the Seraphim to me, and in his hand was alive cold that he had taken from the altar with the tongs. And he laid it upon my mouth and said, 'Lo, this has touched thy lips, and thy iniquity is departed, and thy sin is forgiven!

And I heard the voice of God saying, whom shall I send and who will go for us?" And I said, 'Here am I: send me.' And he replied, 'go, say unto this people: you hear indeed, but understand not; you see indeed, but know not. Made obstinate is the heart of this people; their ears are heavy..and their eyes shut; or else their eyes would see, the ears would hear, and their hearts would understand, in order that they repent and be healed.'

Isaiah's mission was, first of all, to admonish the people and urge them to repent and return to God. He tells them that God is their father, and they are his children. He calls upon the rebellious children to return,

"Here, or heavens. and give ear O, Earth, for God has spoken. 'Children have I nourished and brought up, but they have rebelled against me. The ox knows his owner, and the donkey his master's crib, but Israel does not know my people does not consider...

Is. 29:13 The people honor God with their lips, but not with their lives. **Theme 1** Integration of worship and work

Is. 32:15-20 By the power of God's spirit, people will dwell in peace, security and enjoyment of their work. **Theme 4** – God wills our peace
