In the baptism of the Spirit, which the Church receives at Pentecost, she is washed clean in the blood of Christ; she arises with Him; she is imbued with the fullness of new life. Today she stands with the divine dowry which Christ earned for her and gave to her. She is bright with the glory of eternal youth and fertility as she stands at the side of her heavenly bride-groom. Now she has been prepared for that arduous life for which she is destined upon earth. She has been prepared to share the life of her bridegroom and to remain faithful to Him in spite of all that may befall her; she is prepared to represent Him under all circumstances, and joyfully to bring forth new generations of children. The Holy Spirit, the Spirit of love and truth, dwells within her and operates in her. He is the soul of the body of the Church. He guides her and leads her to her eternal nuptials with her divine spouse, Jesus Christ. That is the meaning of the mission of the Holy Spirit and of the feast of Pentecost.

We complete our series on Judge Gideon and begin with Abimelech

Let No Man Rule in Your Life

Once Gideon had fought the Midianites, the Israelites request he rule over them. They felt that Gideon had saved them from certain demise. In their persuasion, they remind Gideon that his children and grandchildren would have the spoils of royalty.

In Judges 8:23, Gideon turns down the Israelite's request. He reminds the Israelites that they already have a king. He tells them that the Lord will rule over them.

Gideon's response reminds us we should let no man be the ruler of our lives. He is telling us that if we have Christ in our lives, then we have all we need. If we let God rule our lives, we can enjoy the spoils of royalty as well because we will be co-heirs with Christ.

A Little Can Be a Lot

Gideon was just a young boy when God called Him out. He didn't feel that he had what it would take to complete the enormous task God was giving him. What he didn't understand was that God was not looking at Gideon's qualifications in that moment. His call had nothing to do with the quantity of deeds Gideon had done. He was looking at the quality of Gideon's heart. Gideon trusted and followed God. Because of his obedience, God gave Gideon a crown. One that has far more value than any earthly crown. God is not look of the best qualities and the most accolades. He is seeking those who, like Gideon, are regular people laboring for Christ in their daily lives.

Serving God faithfully in not about quantity. It is all about quality.

It is Easy to Fall Away from God

Gideon accomplished a big, important task. His people were grateful to him. They wanted him to be their king. Gideon did the right thing when he turned down the offer to rule over them. In that moment, Gideon was on a righteous path. He was walking with God.

At the end of Gideon's story, we are reminded that it is incredibly easy to fall away from God. Gideon had done all the right things, yet he built a golden ephod. In Judges 8:27, we read that once Gideon made the golden ephod, all the people Israel began worshipping it.

After all that Gideon had accomplished with God, it would seem that the Israelites would have learned their lesson. Every battle fought and won had given the Israelites freedom to live as God desired them to. *Next issue we begin our series on Judge Abimelech.*

Pentecost Sunday Caution: Spirit at Work

If Pentecost celebrates the gifts of the Spirit, it can tempt us to separate the Spirit from the Father and Jesus. Sometimes we think of the Father as the God of the Old Testament, Jesus as center of New Testament, and the Spirit as God of the present age, almost as if the Father and Jesus were enjoying their retirement. Actually, all three persons share one God-life. Instead of three gods debating the fate of the universe, we have one God who is over all and in all.

The Spirit has been active in all ages. The prophets were empowered by the Spirit to proclaim God's word to Israel. Jesus was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit. The Spirit led Jesus into the desert at the beginning of his ministry. (Search the word "spirit" in the four gospels and it appears 75 times.) Jesus was filled with the Spirit as he preached and worked miracles. Then at Pentecost the disciples were filled with the Spirit.

So what about Pentecost? It is really about using our gifts and sharing the good news. The Spirit gives us the power, courage, and energy to do this. The Spirit's gifts are meant to be shared. The prophets could not help proclaim God's message. Jesus shared all he knew with his disciples. The disciples went out to the world to spread the news of Jesus' death and resurrection. So we, too, are given gifts to be shared.

The greatest gift we have been given is the news of our salvation. This feast reminds us to share that with others. We may do that by example, as when we worship together, forgive others, give to the poor or help someone in need. We can also share that news by teaching our children about God and his love for them, teaching them to pray, or sharing our faith with other adults. As we come to realize how much God has done for us and how close he is to us, we will want to share that with others. Obviously, we can't make everyone believe in Jesus. But how sad would it be if someone we know was looking for the truth and we neglected to offer it?
